
ADMIRAL // THE OUT OF THE WAY HEART OF SEATTLE.



ISTORY The first European settlers, led by Arthur Denny, landed in this area in 1851 at the mouth of the Duwamish River in what would later become Alki in West Seattle. After battling a harsh winter, and splitting into two groups (one of which decided to move on to modern day downtown Seattle) the remaining group moved their encampment to the top of a nearby hill. There isn't a lot of information on the area that became the main business and commercial district of West Seattle, or on the origin of the name of SW Admiral Way, but it may be obvious that this is one of the first areas to be developed in Seattle. Historic Tudors, Craftsman, Dutch Colonial and Victorian style homes easily outnumber contemporaries, and are strategically placed on the edge of the bluff for maximum viewing pleasure.
