

HISTORY The Duwamish people called modern Beacon Hill “Lushootseed,” meaning “Greenish-Yellow Spine;” likely referring to the color of the many deciduous trees that once grew thickly along the hillside. Named and renamed, the area was known as Holgate and Hanford Hill after John Holgate and Edward Hanford who settled there in the 1850s until finally being named Beacon by M. Harwood Young after his hometown in Boston, Massachusetts.

Likely hoping to redefine the area, Seattle opened the Municipal Workhouse and Stockades in 1909, where prisoners serving 15-63 days could be sent to work, clearing the area now known as Jefferson Park, which itself would be used as a makeshift runway in 1918 for US Army warplanes eventually leading up to the placement of Boeing Field at the base of the hill.

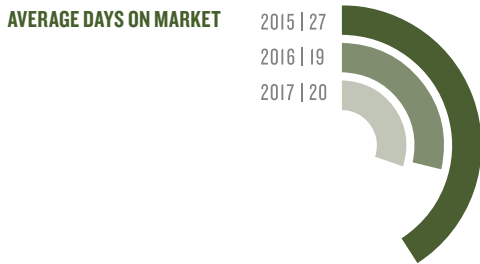

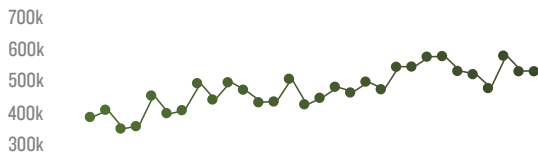

MEDIAN SOLD PRICE



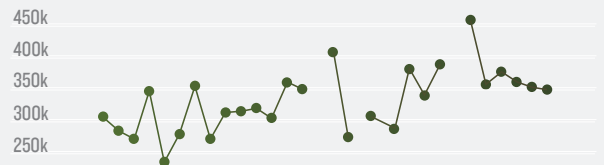
